Covid Policy



1. Itinerary

Friday

- 1200 Start/ Finish confirmed on the website and sent out to mobiles.
- 1500 Boat delivery to start area
- 1500 1900 Registration opens captains wavier form and number collection

Saturday

Optimum start time 0900 (to be confirmed on Friday at Noon, start may be brought forward to no earlier than 0800, all times will move to 1 hour earlier OR Pushed back due to mist this will be decided on the morning)

- 0657 Sunrise
- 0700 Start area opens
- 0715 Registration opens and safety briefing (for slow boats)
- 0730 Registration opens
- 0730 0750 Slow boats on boating
- 0800 Slow boats start
- 0745 Safety meeting for Coxes and Captain's
- 0800 Start of boating
- 0845 All boats on water
- 0900 Start
- 1100 Projected fastest crews at finish
- 1230 First run to collect vehicles from start (or earlier if vehicle is full)
- 1400 2nd run to collect vehicles from start (or earlier if vehicle is full)
- 1530 Expected completion of Race (or earlier if last crew has finished)
- 1615 Presentation
- 1700 Final run to collect vehicles from start

4. Safety and Equipment

- Please provide at least one mobile phone number per crew that we can contact you on from Friday to Sunday.
- Race control will decide whether the conditions are too rough for certain types of boat to race. We
 will endeavour to look at the forecast and move the race forward or back depending on the
 predicted weather.
- We will always race with the best conditions, i.e. with the wind, so the direction of racing will be
 decided on the predicted weather on the day before. If the weather changes overnight then we will
 change the start.
- In flat/crosswind conditions we will race from Dores to Fort Augustus
- The water in the Loch will be <6 degrees, therefore all crews must carry life jackets in their own boat.
- In the event of an extreme change in conditions during the race, there are few major exits. We will
 move crews that cannot continue towards the South Bank and head for Foyers Campsite.
- In the event of a sinking, the safety crews will attempt to aid you into the safety launches. They
 have no responsibility to rescue the boat.
- If using fine boats, please ensure that the bulkheads are sealed properly by you not assume the manufacturer has done it and you will be required to carry pumps.
- Please insure your own boats as the race has no control over your actions.
- Please make every effort to avoid collisions with other crews. The race is 21 miles long so you
 really don't need to clash.
- The Loch is open to all boats, so follow the South Bank (Foyers) from Fort Augustus and the North Bank if leaving Dores. The race will start before the commercial boats leave the Fort Augustus End.

5. Start / Finish Logistics

- At both the start and finish there will be a basic set up as we are in a fields. There will be portable toilets and changing tents, along with a large tent with music in case of rain.
- There is no running water at either end of the course, so please bring the water with you before the race. Our water sponsor **Actiph Water** will provide some water at the finish for participants.
- It will be possible to purchase pizza and some other food at the finish and if the finish is Dores there is a pub on the waters edge, in Fort Augustus there are multiple places to eat.
- There will be vehicles going from the start to the finish. If you require bags to go to the finish
 please load them in the cars at least 30 minutes before race start (0830)
- Whilst we know that you will be tired after racing, please show respect to your other competitors by
 moving your vessel from the immediate shore to the neighbouring field in a timely manor to allow
 people to land safely.



6. Return to start Buses

- Due to Covid19, we would ask that all event participants endeavour to arrange their own lifts back to the start line.
- We will be able to offer very limited numbers of transfers, and therefore would ask that you contact us at the earliest opportunity, if you require a lift.
- Please note we can only offer one member of your crew a lift and we will need this name prior to racing.
- Anyone receiving a lift will have to wear a face mask as per government policy in Scotland.

7. Boat Hire

- Borrowed/hired boats will arrive on Friday morning and leave Sunday morning
- Boats must be returned in the same state they are received.
- Life jackets will be provided where required.

8. Image Rights

- All crews must nominate one crew member to be interviewed before or after the race.
- All crews must allow us to use video and still images in marketing of Monster the Loch and other Row Tours Ltd and Rowing Centre UK Ltd advertisements/media outlets.

9. Presentation

 Due to covid19, we will not be holding a dedicated presentation ceremony. Though of course individual covid safe celebrations are not to be discouraged

We understand that you may have questions over what the event will be like this year and would like to reassure you that our team has been working closely with the local authorities and key stakeholders to deliver an amazing event experience for everyone involved while doing everything we can to keep you safe.

Whilst the event is taking place after Scotland moved beyond Level 0 on 9th August, there will still be Covid safety measures in place during the event which we respectfully ask you to follow, both for your own safety, those around you and for our participants, event crew, volunteers and the local community.

Please be responsible and only travel to and take part in the event having followed this guidance.

IMPORTANT

DO NOT attend the event if you are showing any COVID-19 symptoms:

HIGH TEMPERATURE NEW OR LOSS OR CHANGE IN TASTE AND/OR SMELL

CONTINUOUS COUGH

DO NOT TRAVEL TO THE EVENT IF...

you have tested positive, have any Covid-19 symptoms or if you have been contacted by Test & Protect Scotland (Track & Trace in England) and asked to self-isolate. You must not travel to the event if you are isolating or in quarantine after foreign travel.

FACE COVERINGS

Scottish Government recommends that all participants attending the event wear a face covering outdoors in crowded areas, and particularly when queuing for registration, buses, baggage, toilets and food.

Face coverings are mandatory on bus and coach transport.

TESTING

All participants, event crew, volunteers and everyone coming to the event are advised to take a lateral flow test within 24 hours of attending the event. These can be ordered in advance online. Thank you for your cooperation with this.

SANITISER STATIONS

There will be hand sanitiser stations located at the start and finish areas. We recommend you also bring your own personal hand sanitiser.

RESPECT OTHERS SPACE

We ask you to respect others and give space to those around you at the race start and finish areas and the food area
